RESEARCH INTERESTS

Spirituality and religion play a central role in the lives of many North Americans. However, links between spiritual/religious variables and affective disorders remain largely ambiguous due to a lack of rigorous, clinically-relevant, empirical study. My program of research therefore takes an evidence-based approach to this understudied subject. My specific research interests include:

- The relationship of religion/spirituality to symptoms of anxiety and affective disorders
- The dissemination of empirically supported treatments to religious populations
- The integration of spiritual/religious content into empirically supported treatments
- The operational definition and measurement of spiritual and religious variables
